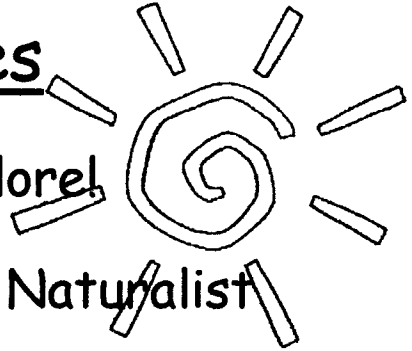

Weekly Theme Descriptions

Each week is designed to meet the needs of all age groups and work in collaboration together to build onto the designated theme. Daily activities and projects will be offered to students and will encourage interaction and creativity. Descriptions are an overview of weekly events. Students will also be able to utilize the Le Sueur Public Library's reading program (free of charge). Weekly visits will be made and sign-up will be done the first week of camp.

Gardens Galore!

Children will plant a garden with flowers and vegetables, which they will tend throughout the summer. As vegetables become ready, students will be able to eat them at snack time and if yields are high enough, they will be able to take samples home with them. Children will also learn lifecycles and germination of plants and what they are used for in every day life-particularly in Minnesota and the Midwest. *Students will also plant tropical milkweed in preparation of Monarch Madness.*

Nature Eco Naturalist

This week is a dedication to nature and the natural cycle of the food chain. Students will help create a food chain by drawing a mural of plants, insects, animals, etc. Children will go on a nature scavenger hunt using the alphabet as a guide. Local naturalists will come to camp to present.

Proud To Be An American

With the week leading up to our nation's birthday, students will be indulged with red, white and blue! From everything that is traditionally celebrated as American, students will have a hand in! This week students will have a watermelon eating contest, celebrate America's 233rd birthday with a picnic, create their own flags and make homemade apple pie.

Survivor: Minnesota

A spin-off of the popular reality television series, students will be faced with obstacle courses and challenges. Students will be broke up into teams and points will be kept throughout the week. Teams will design a flag/mascot, pick out a team name and tie-dye T-shirts.

Baseball Classic

Children will engage in a camp baseball game, have a classic baseball lunch, watch the movie Sandlot and enjoy popcorn and peanuts. Children will also track the MN Twins wins and losses and participate in "All Star" games.

Dog Days of Summer

As the days of summer become hot and muggy, children will enjoy a trip to the public swimming pool. Activities will feature water safety, summer weather

patterns and severe weather. Children will create a weather mobile. Other summer games will be incorporated.

Monarch Madness

Children will become parents of monarch eggs and rear them through each life stage including caterpillar to butterfly. The Monarchs will use the tropical milkweed planted during the first week at camp to feed the caterpillars. Eventually, after the butterflies mature out of their cocoons, students will release them into the wild. Activities will include creating a monarch lifecycle booklet and designing their own butterfly.

Being a Le Sueurian

Students will enjoy a tour of the Mayo House; learn about The Green Giant Company and the founder of Le Sueur. Students will also learn the Le Sueur-Henderson's School Song and have the chance to eat sweet corn.

Pooh and The 100 Woods

This week is all about Winnie the Pooh and the friends of The 100 Acre Woods. Children will create their own Pooh Bear, watch a Winnie the Pooh movie, read stories and participate in friendship and team building games. This week is dedicated to preparing children with fairness and equality strategies as they enter into a new school year by using Winnie the Pooh and friends as an instructional tool.

When I Grow Up....

Children will make a timeline of their life using their own footprints. Children will also learn about cause and effect and predictions where they will predict what they might like to be when they grow up. A local professional will present to the children (most likely a fireman, police man, etc). The last day of the week will be a camp party to celebrate the summer's end!
